

#### Kevis House Exhibition at the Petworth Festival 2025

The Resilient River

#### Opening Preview for Festivalgoers on Thursday 17 July between 5.00 - 8.30pm

Our regular gallery partner Kevis House has invited a handful of their artists to explore a section of the Western Rother. This Resilient River is fed by springs and streams from the North and South Downs, as well as springs within it, as it meanders on a West to East flowing course from multiple villages beyond Midhurst to Stopham to the east of Petworth where it joins the River Arun.

The resulting exhibition *The Resilient River* will show contrasting work: watercolours, oils, graphite, fine pencil drawings, ink drawings and wood engravings, the aim being to share images of the Western Rother as a source of life, with much wildlife reliant on it, whilst respecting it is treasured by a community keen to protect it, and recognising that its history can be glimpsed in the traces of the past that still remain.
